Contemporary Oil Painter | Plein Air Specialist Born 1950 in Vancouver, Canada Lives and Work in Vancouver, BC, Canada

Biography

Dennis Brown was a celebrated Canadian contemporary artist known for his mastery of plein air oil painting. Born in 1950 and based in Vancouver, Brown's subject matter was drawn directly from life, focusing on landscapes, mountains, lakes, and sunsets across the Pacific Northwest and beyond.

Dennis followed the artistic footsteps of his mother and studied at the University of British Columbia, the Emily Carr Academy of Art and Design, and the Vancouver Academy of Art. His work was shaped by influential teachers such as Gordon Smith, Marcus Bowcott, Joseph Montague, Michael Britten, Gordon Findlay, and Rob Wilson, and he was mentored for several years by Canadian landscape artist Paul Chizik.

While his early work included abstract and politically themed paintings, Dennis ultimately embraced his love for nature through the traditional plein air method. His paintings are held in private collections across Canada, the United States, Europe, and Australia. In 2017, he was named among the '35 Hot Vancouver Artists to Look Out For.'
